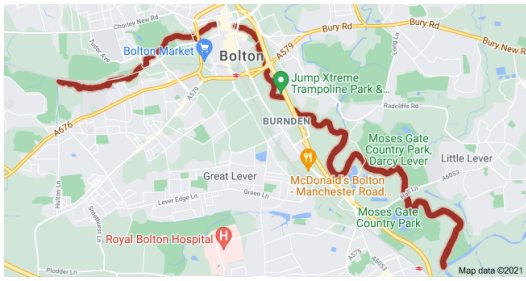

Geographical Concepts	
process	a continuous action, operation, or series of changes taking place in a definite manner.
sustainability	the quality of not being harmful to the environment or depleting natural resources, and thereby supporting long-term ecological balance.

Core Vocabulary	
Erode	to eat into or away; destroy by slow consumption or disintegration.
Cycle	a recurring period of time, especially one in which certain events or phenomena repeat themselves in the same order and at the same intervals.
Habitat	the natural environment of an organism; place that is natural for the life and growth of an organism.
Pollution	the introduction of harmful substances or products into the environment.
