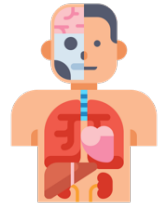

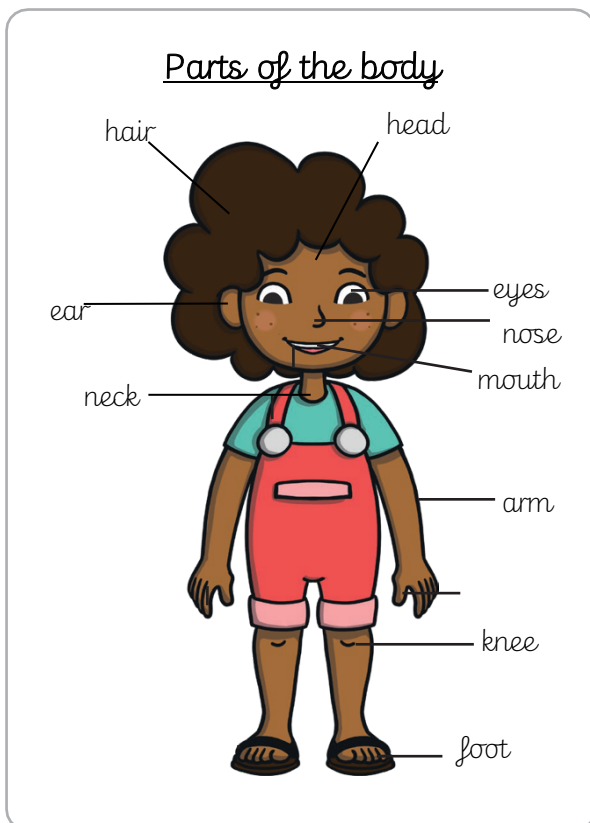

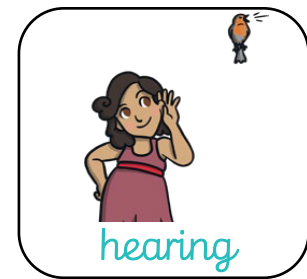
Scientific Concepts

Function	What something does or is used for.
Environment	The circumstances, objects, or conditions by which one is surrounded
Core Vocabulary	
Hearing	Your ears let you listen to all the things around you. Your brain is able to tell what different sounds are.
Taste	Your sense of taste comes from your tongue. You can tell if something tastes bitter or sweet.
Smell	You smell using your nose. Your nose can tell if things smell nice or not nice.
Sight	Your eyes let you see all the things around you.

Key Knowledge

1	Our senses help us to understand what is happening around us.
2	There are five senses: sight, touch, taste, hearing and smell.
3	We use our ears to hear and our brain is able to tell what the different sounds are.
4	Our skin gives us the sense of touch. We can tell if something is warm, cold, smooth or rough without even looking at it.
5	Our sense of taste comes from our tongue. Our tastebuds tell our brain if something tastes bitter, sweet, salty or sour.
6	People may not have all 5 senses fully developed, for example someone may have hearing loss or be deaf, but they can communicate through lip reading or sign language.
